# **Interstate Highways**

- Tunica is only minutes away from I-55,
   I-40 and the new I-69 providing interstate
   access to the resorts of Tunica, making
   it one of the most accessible travel
   destinations in the U.S.
- Approximately \$53.4 million was spent from 1992-2006 to upgrade Tunica's four-lane roads and highways, building them to resort standards.

 Major expansions at Tunica Airport including a runway extension to 7,000 feet, a passenger terminal and construction of a 20,000-square-foot airport hangar now enable Tunica to grow our transportation offerings.

## **Recreational Facilities**

 The Tunica RiverPark allows visitors to better see and understand the Mississippi River with a museum and interpretive center, observation deck and nature trails.



 The 400-passenger Tunica Queen riverboat provides visitors a chance to experience the Mighty Mississippi up close on a relaxing river cruise.  The 48,000-square-foot Tunica Arena & Expo Center is designed to accommodate a wide variety of events including equine and trade shows.

# How the Tunica Miracle Began

In 1990, the Mississippi Legislature legalized gaming as a way to create badly needed jobs and bring new industry to the river and costal areas. Tunica's civic and



business leaders adopted gaming as part of an economic development strategy and the "Tunica Miracle" began.

In 1992, Splash casino landed in Tunica, creating jobs and world class casino resorts almost overnight. More than \$3 billion has since been invested in Tunica and more than 16,000 new jobs have been created. Subsequently, Tunica County's budget grew from \$3.5 million in 1992 to \$56.6 million in 2006.

### Tunica RiverPark

The Tunica RiverPark has welcomed more than 150,000 visitors in three years and received many awards and accolades. Docked there is the Tunica Queen riverboat, offering Mississippi River cruises.



# Tunica National Golf & Tennis Club

The Mark McCumber-designed championship golf course hosted more than 30,000 rounds of golf in 2006; the Club's indoor tennis courts were awarded the USTA's Outstanding Facility Award.



# **Tunica Airport**

More than 30,000 commercial, charter and private passengers were welcomed in 2006 at the Tunica Airport which recently completed a runway expansion to 7,000 feet.




# **Tunica Arena & Exposition Center**


The Tunica Arena holds more than 180 show days each year bringing approximately 43,000 event attendees to Tunica annually.

COUNTY/STATE GAMING REVENUE GROWTH in Millions 1992-2006






### TUNICA COUNTY JOB GROWTH in Thousands 1992-2006




### TUNICA COUNTY ANNUAL AVERAGE WAGE in Thousands 1990-2005



**Hotel Occupancy Rates in Percentages** 


